The Gateway would like to strongly suggest that residents maintain renter's insurance on a policy commonly known as HO-4. Please consult with a qualified insurance agent to obtain appropriate coverage for fire, flood, theft, liability and other perils.

We have discontinued using the BuildingLink email link for service orders. As an alternative you may use our Service@theGateway.com to email your service orders.

When you enter the front door to your building, please be aware of persons who may attempt to walk behind you into the building without using their KAC card. Intruders have accessed the buildings and the rooftops by following residents as they enter the building. Please remember that The Gateway buildings have controlled, not secure, access. Your help in excluding those persons who are not authorized to enter your building, is greatly appreciated.

Our staff continues to find trash and recyclables that have been discarded on the floors in the disposal rooms. Your trash is required to be placed in plastic bags and disposed of inside the trash chute. Small recyclables may be discarded inside the recycling disposal chute. Large recyclables are to be taken to the recycling center in your building; never forced into the recycling chute or discarded inside the recycling disposal room. Please properly dispose of your trash and recyclables. All compost must be bagged via compostable "bio bags" and disposed of in the compost bin located on the basement level of your garage.

Please promptly remove your clothes when your washer and dryer have completed their final cycles. Please be considerate of your neighbors, particularly when the laundry room is very busy and other residents are waiting to use the machines. Please do not use more than three (3) washers or dryers at any one time.

TRASH TALK

Here we go again! Plastic!! It's still showing up in the compost bin. I just don't know what to do. Maybe you can help. What can we do to reach residents who go to the trouble of taking compost down to the recycle center but then contaminate the entire load by putting plastic in the bin?

Seriously, I need your help. If you have a suggestion, any suggestion, please share it with me. Even if it seems way out - let's give it a try. The recycling program is five years old and we still have some serious gaps. As usual, I'll share your thoughts with GG management.

While we're on the subject, I've been asked to repeat the ground rules for compost. Include all food scraps like meat and bones, fruit and vegetables, soiled paper, napkins, paper towels, newspaper, miscellaneous items such as cooking string or twine, cheese cloth, tooth picks, wooden skewers, and, of course, anything labeled "compostable." A good rule-of-thumb: If it was once living matter it's probably compostable (cloth excluded). And just in case the point hasn't been made - NO PLASTIC - hard or soft - EVER in the compost!
